

PREPARATION FOR SCRAMENTS

The requirement for receiving First Reonciliation is completion of first and second grade Religious. The requirements for receiving First Holy Communion are receiption of First Reconciliation and completion of second and third grade Religious Education.


The Sacrament of Confirmation is celebrated in 9th Grade. The Diocesan requirement is completion of 7th and 8th grade Religious Education in class.

The Pantry can always use:


Beans (no green *beans please*)



First Reading: Isaiah 22:19-23


This passage refers to the use of authority and indicates the Key as the symbol of authority. The words "open" and "shut" refer to the power that will eventually be given to Peter.

Second Reading: Romans 11:33-36

Paul writes ecstatic and praise-filled words about God's plan for his people. In him, he writes, "all things are."

Gospel: Matthew 16:13-20

When Jesus asks his disciples, "Who do you say that I am?" Peter exclaims, "You are the Messiah!" Christ then declares that Peter is the "Rock" upon which he will build his Church, promising him the power "to bind" and "to loose.


A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY **READINGS**

Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time August 27, 2023

"He asked his disciples: 'Who do people say that the Son of Man is?' They replied, 'Some say John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.' He said to them, 'But who do you say that I am?' Peter said in reply: 'You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.""

The all important question as we speak about Jesus. In our world we find people describing Jesus in so many ways. People have their opinion - teacher, Son of Mary or the carpenter's son. He is the miracle worker, the visiting preacher in the synagogue. 'What a friend I have in Jesus', He is the just judge. All are correct descriptions. They tell us about Jesus.

Today He asks me - who am I for you? Pause for a moment and think about your answer before you presume or speak. The final answer is: Jesus Christ is my personal Savior, and without Him there is little meaning in my life. As Peter made his response and was blessed by the Lord. so my response seeks His grace and blessing. Tell someone else who Jesus is for you, and like Jesus, ask who Jesus is for them.
